Canyon, Wynndel, Kitchener as well as the east shore of Kootenay Lake. Tourism, fruit, wine and dairy production, logging and light industry are the main drivers of the economy. Creston is a rich agricultural valley. While the fertile fields are home to large scale farming operations, many

residents enjoy small hobby farms, backyard gardening or planting raised beds in the community garden. With a long growing season, garden and orchards are filled to bursting with local produce.

The Creston Valley is a wonderful playground for children and families. In the ever-growing network of friends and neighbours that exists here, children are cherished. Education is a strong focus in Creston. There are four elementary schools serving the area, including a French Immersion option. Creston also has a large support network for parents who choose to home-school their children as well as popular outdoor program for high school students called Yeti. Kootenay River Secondary School

(KRSS) offers a full range of pre-university courses, several innovative apprenticeship programs and extra-curricular programs including competitive basketball, soccer & volleyball teams and a strong drama and fine arts program. KRSS graduates have gone on to attend and excel at universities, colleges, technical schools as well as athletics at an international & Olympic level.

The Creston and District Community Complex offers programs for all ages and skill levels in a variety of sports including swim club, soccer, baseball, hockey, figure skating, curling, skate boarding, pickle ball and so much more! In the Creston Valley, there are music lessons, dance lessons, an active community theatre, and summer naturalist programs. Guides and Scouts are both active in the community as is the 4-H club for young farmers.

There is an abundance of things to do in and around the Creston Valley. Your kids will love it here, and so will you!

Blessed with a temperate climate, Creston is a year-round playground for people who love the outdoors. While much of Canada is still buried in snow. HEALTH SERVICES

The Creston Valley Hospital, managed by Interior Health Authority is the local full-service hospital. It has 20 beds including 24 hour Emergency, an intensive care room, pediatric room and maternity wing. The hospital also offers a full service lab, x-ray and ultrasound services. Full public health services, home care nursing, community programs, as well as adult and child mental health services are located at the hospital. Specialist physicians visit CVH site for local referrals and follow up on a rotational basis.

Emergency Department call is mandatory for local doctors (approximately 1 in 11), with obstetrics, surgery and anesthesia GP specialties available. Physicians in Creston practice in a variety of settings. These included solo practice, small group practice as well as a Family Practice Clinic. Two of the Clinics are teaching facilities within the UBC residency program.

Regional Hospitals

Two regional hospitals, each within 90 minutes of Creston, offer the next level of care. These locations have MRI and CT services, as well as specialists, including:
