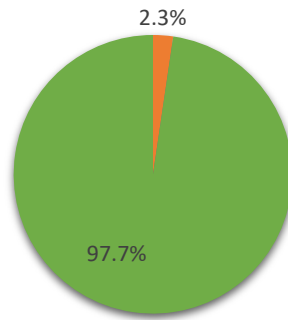

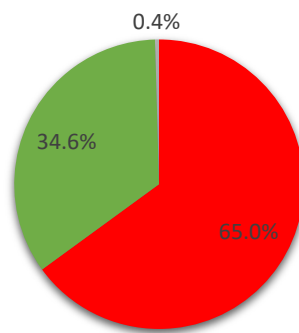
1. Do you live in the Town of Creston?

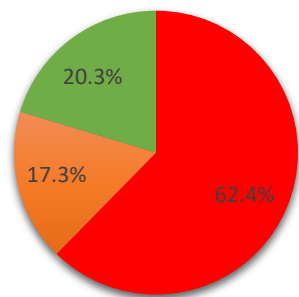

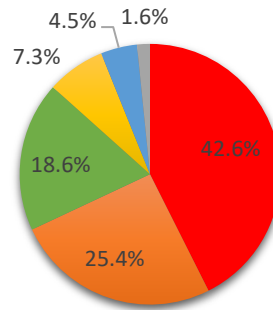
3. Does your household want to keep backyard hens?

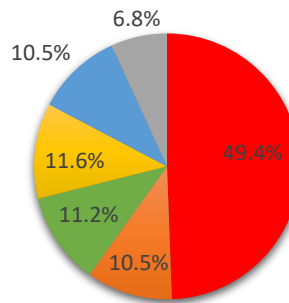
4. If backyard hens are permitted, how many hens should be allowed in the following areas?

Single Family Residential Properties



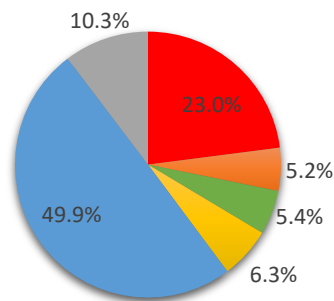

Multi-family Residential Properties



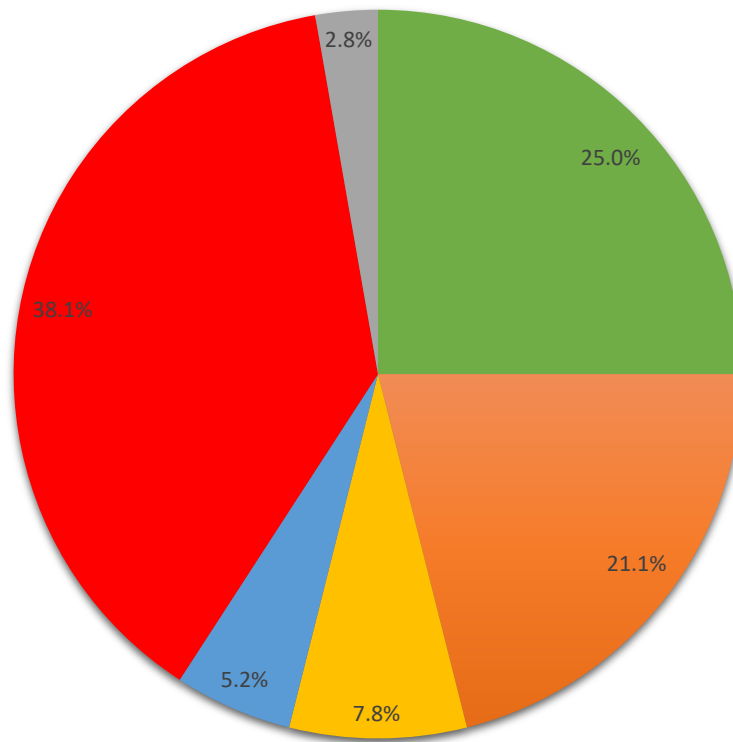

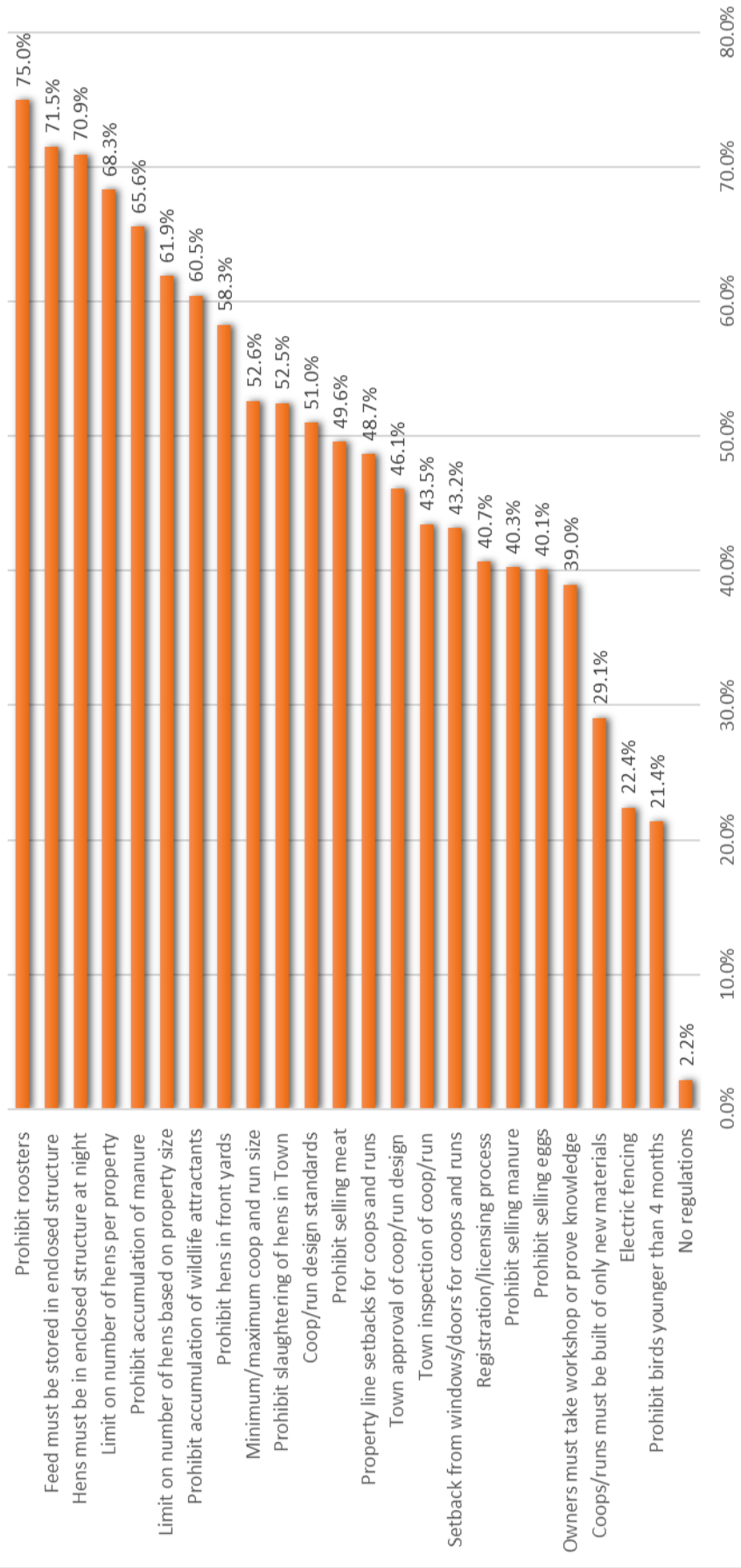

5. What is the MINIMUM property size you feel would be appropriate for backyard hens?

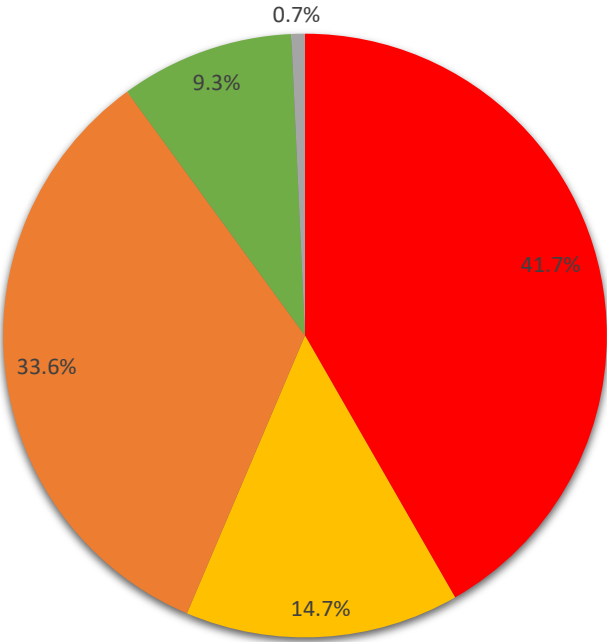


- Small (up to 500m² / 0.125ac). Includes 100% of all single family lots.

- Very Large (minimum 2000m² / 0.5ac). Includes 10% of all single family lots.
- Backyard hens are not appropriate on any property in the Town of Creston.
