Many Properties are Now Able to Have Hens!



After a successful pilot project, Council has approved backyard hens. You can now keep a maximum of six hens if you are located within the R1: Residential - Low Density or R5: Residential - Rural. Hens must have a valid Hen licence and there is some criteria that must be met. Licences expire on the 31st of December each year and must be renewed annually. Are you a business owner with dreams of expanding or revitalizing your commercial space? If so, the Town of Creston has exciting news for you! The Business Investment Incentive Program, designed to fuel growth and development within our community.

So, what is the Business Investment Incentive Program? In simple terms, it's a unique initiative aimed at providing partial relief from the municipal portion of property taxes to incentivize investment in commercial projects. Whether you're looking to develop a new space or breathe new life into an existing one, this program is here to support you.

The objectives of this program are threefold. Firstly, it aims to enhance the visual appeal and vitality of our town, creating an inviting atmosphere for residents and visitors alike. Secondly, by supporting business growth and expanding employment opportunities, the program seeks to bolster economic prosperity within Creston. Finally, it aligns with the municipality's proactive "open for business" approach, attracting both redevelopment and new development of commercial businesses.

How does it work? Upon completion of a commercial project, the program provides relief for a specified term from 100% of the incremental increase in the municipal portion of property taxes resulting from the increase in assessed property value. This means that as your investment pays off and your property value increases, the burden of property taxes is lessened, allowing you to reinvest in your business.

Is your project eligible? The good news is that a variety of projects qualify under the program. Whether it's new construction with a minimum value of \$150,000 or renovations to an existing building valued at a minimum of \$50,000, you could be eligible for this enticing opportunity. It's important to ensure that all eligible improvements are appropriately zoned, and we encourage you to check out the Revitalization Tax Exemption Bylaw No. 1918, 2020 on our Town of Creston website for further details.
